strengthen connections and collaboration among higher education institutions worldwide, jointly advancing international cooperation in higher education quality assurance and evaluation.

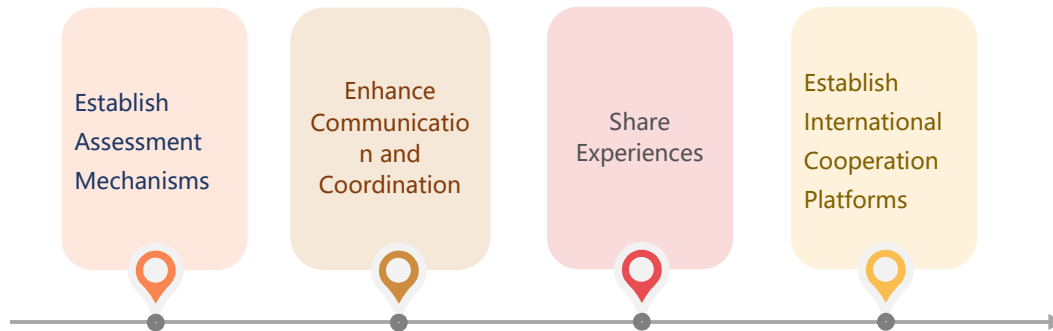


Figure 1. Measures to Strengthen Higher Education Quality
